



















NEATO 2024 Winterfest Schedule Friday, March 15th

11AM-4PM: National Streetcar Museum at Lowell: 25 Shattuck Street, Lowell Massachusetts

To showcase our satellite museum and our longstanding partnership with the National Park Service in Lowell, Massachusetts, we invite you to participate in the following activities before you arrive in Kennebunkport, Maine. We have many exciting activities planned for you in Lowell including a visit to the Lowell National Historical Park which includes the Boott Cotton Mill Museum and the Mogan Cultural Center, The National Streetcar Museum (a satellite museum of Seashore), and of course a ride on New Orleans Car 966 which will be celebrating its 100th anniversary this year.

Free parking is available at the HCID garage (350A Dutton Street) on the lower level in the area designated for National Park Service visitors. **Be sure to have your ticket validated at the National Park Service Visitor Center,** which is a short walk from the garage; follow the signs. On-street parking is available for a nominal fee on streets closer to the museum.

The National Park Service Visitor Center provides an excellent overview of the park's offerings. **The National Streetcar Museum at Lowell** is a short walk diagonally across the street from the Visitor Center. Due to track construction that normally would allow trolley boarding to happen adjacent to our museum, our volunteers will guide you to Boott Cotton Mill Museum, where you can hop aboard New Orleans Car 966 and take you on a tour of the working track. Please note guest operations are not available in Lowell. Additionally, the car is **not handicapped accessible nor heated**. The National Park Service owns three Lowell trolley reproductions built by the Gomaco Company in the early 1980's. One of them will be parked on the siding for viewing adjacent to the Boott Cotton Mill Museum. Please note that the car barn will not be open for inspection.

Following your ride, visit the Boarding House and One City, Many Cultures exhibit in the <u>Mogan Cultural Center</u>, which will be open from 12PM-4:30PM and is free of charge. The National Park Service Visitor Center will also be open 12PM-5PM. All sites will have either Ranger or Volunteer interpreters.
